



Fuel Farm Wet Commissioning

WSI Fuel Farm

Dear Neighbour,

We're writing to update you on plans for Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI) to start bringing jet fuel to the WSI Fuel Farm. This is part of our Terminal and Specialty Services contractor, Multiplex's, commissioning requirements, which are being carried out in collaboration with Skytanking Australia.

The purpose of this is to introduce aviation fuel into the Fuel Farm facility so we can test all of its components and ensure the facility operates as intended before the airport opens for commercial operations in late 2026.

What to expect

The first fuel delivery is scheduled for Monday 10 February 2025, with deliveries happening during March and April. The deliveries will take place between 7am-7pm on weekdays only.

Fuel trucks will enter the site via The Northern Road, then onto Adams Road and will exit right off the roundabout onto Anton Road before entering the Fuel Farm. Fuel trucks will exit the site via this same route to The Northern Road.

During this time, you may notice an increase in traffic and noise. Our top priority is to ensure each delivery is carried out safely. We will of course also endeavour to minimise any impact to the community as much as possible.

What's the purpose of the commissioning?

It is a regulatory requirement for our Fuel Farm to be pre-tested with aviation fuel prior to operations. This activity is being completed now to ensure the newly constructed facility is operating correctly ahead of commercial operations in late 2026.

The entire commissioning process is expected to run for approximately five months. Once the fuel deliveries are complete in March and April, the remaining process will involve testing and commissioning the infrastructure and equipment within the bounds of the Fuel Farm.

Safety on site

There are strict controls in place to manage our response in the event of an emergency, with safety shutdown functions in place at the facility to enable the prompt cut-off of fuel operations, should the need arise.

The facility has been designed and built with wet and dry fire systems and firefighting equipment including fire extinguishers, which are readily accessible.

All drivers will complete induction training before coming onto the site, which will include adherence to WSI's Fuel Farm safety and compliance requirements.
