From Groundwork to Gateway: WSI ready for our next chapter

June was a cracking month for our team with CPB Contractors / ACCIONA, BMD Constructions and Seymour Whyte Construction and Multiplex handing over our three main construction packages.

We marked the occasion with two big events. Minister Catherine King was on hand to officially announce our new runway and key airside facilities and then a couple of weeks later, Prime Minister (PM) Anthony Albanese attended and unveiled our beautiful terminal and surrounding landside works.

The completion of the runway marks a massive achievement involving thousands of workers contributing from the very beginning of our 2019 bulk earthworks program, which transformed WSI from farmland and rolling hills into a landscape able to accommode our 3.7km runway. Millions of tonnes of high strength quarry materials were imported to site, then processed and placed in the aircraft pavement areas, to construct the aviation pavements to strict specifications.

Alongside this we installed approximately 3,000 aeronautical ground lights and 348 high intensity approach lights, along with construction of the taxiway pavements, aircraft pavement markings, airside roads, surface water drainage, airside security fence and landscaping.

CONSTRUCTION HOURS

Standard construction hours: Monday to Friday: 7am - 6pm Saturday 8am - 1pm

Out of hours works:

Our works are generally carried out within standard construction hours, however, there may be certain activities or unavoidable circumstances which require out of hour works. Out of hours works will continue for remaining projects (e.g. Cargo Precinct) due to impacts from wet weather. Ongoing and upcoming out of hours activities at the airport include:

- Monday to Saturday: 5am 10pm -Landscaping, including mowing
- Monday to Sunday: 5am 12am Low impact works such as survey, geotech, inspections, refuelling, plant servicing and maintenance
- Monday to Saturday: 3am 8pm Operation and maintenance of batch plants

Monday to Friday: 7am - 7pm - Fuel Farm wet commissioning

 Monday to Sunday: 24 hours - Earthworks, excavation, drainage works and pavement construction, concrete works, steel erection, building services installation, paving works, concrete saw cutting, material importation, oversized deliveries and removal of machinery.

Other site-wide construction works, along with other minor works determined not to have any impact on the community will also be carried out Monday to Sunday over 24 hours.

THE CARGO PRECINCT: DELIVERED BY CPB ACCIONA JOINT VENTURE

This package includes the design and construction of purpose-built cargo facilities, aircraft pavements, airside roads, truck staging areas, carparking, lighting and service facilities.

The team have made excellent progress over the last three months with all internal ground slabs within the main building now complete. Finishing activities are well underway across the five tenancies with internal tenant dividing walls progressing, and installation of key operational elements including fast action doors, roller shutters, louvres, dock levellers, internal stairs, and balustrades all well advanced. All this work is clearly defining the functional layout of the cargo facility. The team have also installed the precast panels and structural steel for the Services Building superstructure, with their focus now turning to completion of finishes, ongoing services installation, and preparation for commissioning activities in the coming months.

The Airside and Pavement team have also been busy with the final drainage line installed and more than 75% of the landside drainage completed. They've completed the Fuel line installation and associated backfilling, as well as installing two 15 tonne high voltage kiosk pits. The trenching works for rising main works from the Cargo Precinct to Terminal building is also progressing well and work on the aircraft pavement subgrade layers is 70% complete. The team paved 13500m3 of concrete on the apron in the month of May alone! Preparing batters and large swales for landscaping also commenced in June.

In advance of our opening next year, we're excited to place our 2025-2045 Preliminary Draft Master Plan out on public exhibition until Tuesday, 2 September 2025.

The draft plan, which sets out a blueprint for WSI's development over the next 20 years is made up of four key chapters and an appendix.

- Introduction covering airport facilities and infrastructure and provides context about the Master Plan process and the relevant legislative requirements.
- Planning context an overview of the strategic planning context and outlines the airport's envisaged growth, including passenger and cargo forecasts.
- Sustainability overview of WSI's sustainability vision and environmental strategy.
- 4. Forward Plans sets out WSI's long-term plans for sustainable growth, including land use, airside development, terminals and aviation support, ground transport, utilities development, non-aviation development and airport safeguarding.

READYING YOU FOR TAKE OFF

We've partnered with Western Sydney University and the Bradfield Development Authority to launch a new micro credential course – 'Introduction to Aviation Operations'.

The course purpose is to prepare the local workforce ahead of our opening next year. Designed for school leavers, career changers, and current workers, the course equips learners with job-ready skills for roles like ramp operations, ground handling, and security screening. It also offers a nationally recognised 'Statement of Attainment' aligned with the 'Certificate I in Aviation'.

With our opening day just around the corner, many new job opportunities will become available across the airport precinct. The course is a great way to connect people with practical, accessible education and training pathways that can lead them to those job opportunities.

'Introduction to Aviation Operations' is taking applications now and priced at \$350. It also offers scholarships for Indigenous Australians, people with disability, and women returning to work.

A NEW SUBURB NAME FOR THE AIRPORT

With WSI currently spread across four major suburbs, we're proposing to create a new suburb which will take in our entire airport precinct, helping to forge a unique identity for Australia's newest airport. We've made an application to the Geographical Names Board (GNB) to have our entire airport precinct renamed as a new suburb – Cabrogal.

We have followed the GNB's own guidelines for Aboriginal language to be used in the naming of the new suburbs. The name honours the Indigenous heritage of the area and has been developed in partnership with the Dharug and Cabrogal community Elders

As our operational readiness program marches on, we've seen a number of our WSI Operations team move to our new Airport Operations Control Centre (AOCC) building. The AOCC is set to become the centralised 24/7 command and control 'nerve' centre for managing all day-to-day airport-wide activities.

It's an exciting time for the ops team, who between now and commencement of operations are managing site wide security monitoring as well as coordinating incident/emergency response across the site from the AOCC. The team are also testing systems and preparing for airport trials later this year.
